Feed Fat to Deal with Summer Heat By: Ken Palen

What a great summer to boost the energy in your swine diets. High productivity and high prices mean tighter space in the barns. With summer heat coming this can be a real negative for growth. Properly balanced high lean diets can help keep the hogs growing by condensing the energy in every mouthful of feed. Fat also helps to add flavour to the ration. Like people who like gravy on their potatoes, pigs like a little gravy on their corn and soya meal, especially when it is hot. Not only do you add extra energy but also encourage a more consistent feed intake by adding fat into grower finisher diets, which will get them to market faster while prices are hot and the weather is hot.

Table I. How much fat to add

How Much Fat to Add				
Kg/Tonne of Ration				
Starter Feeds	30 kg Younger	←	Older 40 kg	
Grower Feeds	40 kg Younger	←	Older 15 kg	

Table I. above shows the level of added fat suggested from younger to older pigs in both the starter and the grower finisher pigs. The protein (amino acid) level of the diet must be balanced to the energy level of the diet to get the maximum benefit of feeding fat. Adding 5 kg of soya meal with every 10 kg



added fat will be a good starting point for balancing the diet until your nutritionist can check everything over.

Sows can also benefit from added fat especially during hot weather. The thermal comfort range or zone for a sow is 18°C to 25°C (65°F to 78°F) and her piglets 30°C to 33°C (86°C to 92°C) when the temperature goes above this range a decrease in feed intake can occur, Table II shows the effect.

If feed intake decreases milk intake can decrease resulting in lower weaning weights. Adding fat increases the energy density of the diet and also improves palatability of the rations by adding some gravy to the corn and soya meal.

Increasing the energy in sow diets may also result in other potential benefits:

- Increase the energy density of the sow's colostrum by increasing the milks fat content if fed to sows a week or so before farrowing.
- Reduce body weight loss in the farrowing pen.
- Decrease the interval between weaning and rebreeding, helping to increase litters/sow/year.

Planning for summertime feeding is important every year, but this year for sure, we don't want pigs backing up in the barns. Extra piglets produced and/or heavier piglets weaned are great goals. Good luck with planting and be safe out there. Thank you.
